7th Pay Panel: Cabinet to decide tomorrow

New Delhi, June 28: The much awaited seventh pay commission is going to enter the last phase of implementation soon. The Union Cabinet is expected to take up the recommendations of the 7th Pay Commission tomorrow. As per reports, Prime Minister has directed Finance Ministry to implement the Pay Commission for government employees, and place the Empowered Group of Secretaries report on the central government employees' salary and allowances hike in the next Cabinet meeting on 29 June.

It is expected that Empowered Group of Secretaries panel has raised the fitment factor to around 2.7, up from 2.57 as recommended by the 7th Pay Commission. The entry level salary is expected to rise to Rs 23,000, up from Rs 18,000 as recommended by the AK Mathur panel. Implementation of the Pay Commission report is going to cost the government Rs 1.02 lakh crore. The Commission will revise the pay of nearly 47 lakh Central government employees and 52 lakh pensioners, which will be effective from 1 January, 2016.

No witch-hunt in chopper deal: Modi

From Swamy to Pak, PM covers lot of issues in interview

New Delhi, June 28: Prime Minister Narendra Modi has ruled out a political witch hunt in the probe into the AgustaWestland chopper deal, saying investigating agencies will do a professional job and whatever names come up, 'let's see'. However, he maintained that a 'sin' has been committed and those behind them have had a 'big protective cover'. Modi made the comment while replying to a question by the interviewer on Times Now last evening about a feeling that there is some kind of a political witch hunt and that it could not have been done without political patronage. The case about Agusta helicopters. I can't deny it and I believe that we have the right to doubt that people behind this are very experienced,' said Modi. 'They have perfectly practised the art of doing wrong deeds. They are very experienced and knowledgeable. And one can also smell the fact that such a thing wouldn't have been done without a big protective shield. Now, agencies are probing. Let's see how far the probe goes,' he said. 'There should be no targeting (of individuals). No does my government do it,' he affirmed.



'A sin has been committed. How was it done, who did it and how much was done? Probe agencies will find out in a professional way. Whatever names come out, let's see,' he said. Ticking off Subramanian Swamy, Modi disapproved of his attacks on Raghuram Rajan calling them 'inappropriate' and asserted that the RBI Governor was 'no less patriotic than us'. In a veiled message to the newly-nominated BJP MP, he said the nation will not benefit from 'such craving for

publicity' and added 'if anybody considers himself above the system, then it is wrong'. Modi then went on to praise Rajan, who has said 'no' to a second term in RBI, saying his patriotism was no less and was sure that he would continue to serve India irrespective of whether he was in some position or not. 'My experience with him has been good and I appreciate the work that he has done. He is no less patriotic. He loves India. Wherever he will work, he will work for India and he is patriotic,' Modi said in an apparent riposte to Swamy's attack that Rajan not mentally fully Indian. Speaking about relations with Pakistan in the wake of the terror attack on a CRPF convoy in Kashmir, he said while the engagement for peace was on, forces have been given 'full freedom to answer back' in any manner they have to. He also sought to play down the scuttling of India's bid for NSG membership by China in Seoul last week and exuded confidence that the country will succeed in the effort, saying the process has begun on a 'positive note'.

NIA officer murder: Prime accused held

Noida, June 28: In a major breakthrough, the Uttar Pradesh Special Task Force (STF) today arrested Muneer, the prime accused in the murder of Tanzil Ahmed, Deputy Superintendent of Police of National Investigation Agency. Muneer has been arrested from Noida and has been taken to an undisclosed location for questioning. The Uttar Pradesh Police had announced a reward of Rs two lakh on Muneer, who was absconding in the murder case of Tanzil Ahmed. The police had earlier said Muneer, who is the main accused in the murder case, formed a gang along with his two associates and attacked Tanzil Ahmed, when he was driving back home with his family from a wedding near his village Sahaspur in Bijnoor. According to reports, different investigative agencies along with the NIA are questioning Muneer. Ahmed, an assistant commandant with the Border Security Force (BSF) on deputation to the NIA, was killed by two motorcycle-borne assailants in April this year, when he was driving back home with his family from a wedding near his village Sahaspur in Bijnoor. According to reports, Ahmed had proceeded on leave on 1 April after completing his job as the liaison officer for the five-member Pakistan Joint Investigation Team (JIT) that was in Delhi to probe the Pathankot attack.

Cracks appear in advocates protest

Only talks will solve issue, say senior lawyers

There seems to be a rift among advocates, with the Madras High Court Advocates' Association (MHAA) president disassociating himself from the protests to be held in Chennai by lawyers from today against the recent amendments to the Advocates Act. 'The way is to participate in the committee and replace the unwanted laws with apt ones. That would be a clever way to go about in this situation,' said R C Paul Nagaraj, president of MHAA. Protesting is not the solution. While others are going on the protest, I'm not a part of it, he adds. According to Bar Council of Tamil Nadu and Puducherry vice-president P S Amraj, the main reason for the problem is lack of awareness among the lawyers that the amendments will not be implemented. This has been announced by the Chief Justice of the Madras High Court in full court but the information

- Amendments made to the Advocates Act:
- ❖ Ban on participating in processions or holding placards inside court hall.
 - ❖ Courts can debar erring advocates from practice either temporarily or permanently.
 - ❖ Can debar lawyers who browbeat or abuse judges
 - ❖ Can debar lawyers for laying siege to court halls.
 - ❖ Action for tampering with court records.
 - ❖ Can debar for appearing in court under the influence of liquor
 - ❖ Lawyers would be punished for spreading unsubstantiated allegations against judges
 - ❖ Can debar for accepting money either in the name of a judge or on the pretext of influencing him.

does not seem to have reached the advocates. Only 100 among 1,000 advocates seem to know about this, said Amraj. He also suggested that the best way was to solve the issue through talks. The Chief Justice has invited the advocates for talks and even the Bar Council has encouraged them to do so, but in vain, he said. Reacting to a news that there would be a rail roko tomorrow, he said he was not aware of it or about

who was conducting it. He agreed that this would cause a lot of inconvenience to commuters and lawyers, as responsible citizens, should not indulge in it. In the same way, he said, the litigant public would suffer if there was an indefinite boycott of courts by advocates. Except for Madras High Court and Madurai bench, work has been hit in the other courts, he pointed out. Leading lawyer Sudha Ramal-

ingam dismissed the idea of an indefinite protest though she was sympathetic to the lawyers' cause in the face of the recent amendments and said they were probably not satisfied with an oral order on not implementing the new rules. 'Things have come to a stalemate,' she said. Echoing Amraj's suggestion, she was also for genuine bilateral talks' while advocating withdrawal of the amendments. 'Though she said it is a very sad state of affairs, she was also for ensuring room for free and fair practice for the lawyers. Providing a solution, she called for withdrawing the amendments that put fear and anxiety in the minds of advocates because of a 'strong leash in the hands of the judges without them being harnessed.' At this point of time, there is nothing that cannot be solved by talking, said Amraj. It should not be treated as an ego problem leading to oneupmanship, we should all work together to settle the issue, he adds.

90 sovereigns gold looted at Mugappair
